## Knowing Jesus and Making Him Known

In the Gospels we read the familiar story of Jesus calling ordinary people, fishermen and tax collectors among them, to be the first disciples. After the resurrection these men and women are sent out to 'go and make disciples of all people' (Matt 28 v19), and mission begins.

We too, in our ordinary lives, are called to do God's mission in this community and in the wider world. Our mission is to everyone.

Our new website (lenzieunion.org) has the tag line 'Knowing Jesus and Making Him Known'. We don't need to write a gospel to do this, as some of the first disciples did. Instead we can use our words and actions — a phone call to someone in need, an open door to our hospitality or community events, our support for UK and overseas projects, erecting the cross at Easter. There are so many ways we already share God's love - take a look at the website and see!

In our discussions regarding the future of the church buildings in Lenzie, the Kirk Session have agreed that mission must be at the forefront of our thinking. Our buildings play a part in that mission, however the early disciples had very few buildings – yet the mission grew, and continues to grow to this day.

The emphasis is on the presence of Jesus with us – He assures us 'I am with you always' (Matt 28 v20). We can go in His strength.
